






Spring Forward combined academics with fun and engaging activities to provide 600 children a dynamic camp experience. The Monday – Thursday schedule included math and reading in the morning and afternoons were filled with games and activities led by more than thirty community organizations.

Children attended camps at eleven elementary schools in Rock Island, Milan, and East Moline. The five-week camps were led by a team of teachers, camp counselors, and social workers, with support from community organizations and Read United volunteers.




